

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Vanuatu Situation Report 10 - 03 April 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- On 26 March 2020, the President of Vanuatu signed a declaration for a State of Emergency (SOE) over the whole of Vanuatu for a 2-week period, for the purpose of strengthening COVID-19 prevention and containment measures.
- There are currently no confirmed case(s) of COVID-19 in Vanuatu.
- There is currently one (1) suspected case of COVID-19 in Vanuatu who is currently in isolation.
- One (1) sample from the suspected case has today been sent to Noumea for testing, along with seven (7) samples taken as a precaution from others not considered to be suspected cases (ie. did not fill WHO case definition for COVID-19).
- Surveillance and community awareness activities have been significantly ramped up.
- All persons are being urged to avoid spreading rumours and incorrect information. The Ministry of Health is the primary source of <u>credible and up-to-date health information</u> for Vanuatu and provides information and fields questions through multiple dedicated platforms: website, Facebook, Hotline, free webpage and email. BACKGROUND

On 31 December 2019, the Government of China reported a cluster of cases of pneumonia of unknown cause in Wuhan, Hubei Province. A novel coronavirus was identified in January 2020. Since then, cases have been reported in other parts of China and 189 other countries or territories. On 30 January 2020, the WHO Director-General declared the COVID-19 outbreak a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC). On 11 March 2020, a Global Pandemic was declared.

The purpose of this document by the Ministry of Health (MOH) is to provide an update on the epidemiological situation and preparedness/response health actions taken in Vanuatu. Further health information is available on the MOH COVID-19 webpage (covid19.gov.vu), free-access mobile page (https://bit.ly/vanmoh) and the Health Promotions Vanuatu Facebook page. WHO also issues regular updates and communication materials on the WHO COVID-19 Outbreak webpage and WHO Vanuatu Facebook page.

LOCAL EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION

- At present, there are no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Vanuatu.
- At present, there is one suspected cases of COVID-19 in Vanuatu who is currently in isolation.
- Today, eight (8) samples have been sent to Noumea for testing. One (1) sample is from the suspected case.
 Seven (7) samples are from individuals who displayed some symptoms but are not considered to be suspected cases because they did not fill the WHO case definition for COVID-19; these 7 samples are being tested as a precautionary measure only.
- From 20 26 March 2020, seven (7) samples were sent overseas for testing. All have been negative for novel coronavirus. One (1) sample was from a suspected case (later confirmed negative) and the rest were taken from individuals as a precautionary measure.
- Samples are usually only taken from individuals who fulfil the <u>WHO case definition</u> for COVID-19, which is
 to have symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath) <u>plus</u> travel or contact history. As a precautionary
 measure, samples may be taken from additional individuals based on clinical suspicion.
- Aneityum Island was quarantined due to the visit of a cruiseship (11-12 March) that had passengers who
 later had COVID-19. Recent visitors to Aneityum considered contacts were also quarantined. Quarantine
 was lifted on 26 March 2020 for Aneityum Island and for contacts.

- Recent international arrivals (returning citizens and residents) have been placed in quarantine in a hotel for 14 days (n=62). Daily health checks, psychosocial assessments and support are provided to quarantined individuals and hotel staff. No individuals have displayed signs or symptoms of COVID-19. The quarantine will end on 05 April 2020 following final health clearance in line with Section 12(1) of the Public Health Act, which does not require testing of samples for healthy individuals.
- All persons are being urged to avoid spreading rumours and incorrect information on health and other
 matters. The Government of Vanuatu has issued Directive No. 13 for Social Media Regulations related to
 COVID-19. Official information related to the State of Emergency such as Directives are available on the
 website of the National Disaster Management Office (http://www.ndmo.gov.vu/).

REGIONAL AND GLOBAL EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION

 Confirmed cases and/or deaths are increasing worldwide and in the Pacific region. Eight Pacific countries, territories or areas have local transmission and three countries have reported at least one death.
 Community transmission has not been reported for any countries of the Pacific.

DECLARATION OF A NATIONAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

On 26 March 2020, the President of Vanuatu signed a declaration for a State of Emergency (SOE) over the whole of Vanuatu for a two-week period (until 9 April 2020), for the purpose of strengthening prevention and containment measures in response to the COVID-19 global pandemic. This Declaration allows special powers of the Government as set out in the <u>Disaster Risk Management Act No. 23 of 2019</u> in relation to the COVID-19 global pandemic.

PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE PLAN

The Vanuatu COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Plan was disseminated on 12 March 2020 and may be adapted if needed. The Plan aims to:

- Prevent importation of cases from affected countries
- Slow and stop transmission, prevent outbreaks and delay spread
- · Provide optimized care for all patients, especially the seriously ill
- Minimize the impact of the epidemic on health systems, social services and economic activity

COORDINATION

The following groups have responsibility for coordinating and implementing COVID-19 preparedness and response activities in Vanuatu:

^{*} including probable for some countries; * in the last 24 hours; * Transmission classification: Community transmission is evidenced by the inability to relate confirmed cases through chains of transmission for a large number of cases, or by increasing positive tests through sentinel samples (routine systematic testing of respiratory samples from established laboratories). Local transmission indicates locations where the source of infection is within the reporting location. Imported cases only indicates locations where <u>all cases</u> have been acquired outside the location of reporting.

- National Disaster Management Office (NDMO): national coordination including inter-cluster coordination and response management.
- National Cluster System: includes an Inter-Cluster (Chair: NDMO Director) and eight technical clusters (Education, Emergency Telecommunications, Food Security and Agriculture, Gender and Protection, Health and Nutrition, Logistics, and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) responsible for coordinating within and between sectors.
- Health Incident Management Team: day-to-day health sector operations (Chair: MOH Director of Curative and Hospital Services).
- Hospital and Provincial Health Emergency Operation Centres: day-to-day health sector operations in facilities and provinces (Chairs: respective senior management).

ACTIONS TAKEN

The following update is issued by the COVID-19 Health Incident Management Team (IMT). The Team is comprised of staff from MOH and development partners including WHO, DFAT/VHP, UNICEF, Red Cross, ODI and IsraAID.

Management and Coordination

 In light of the Prime Minister's national address on 17 March 2020 and the Declaration for a State of Emergency on 26 March 2020, MOH and partners are focussing on COVID-19 preparedness activities.

Information and Planning

- Ministry of Health has developed multiple sources of credible local information on COVID-19 to reach a broad audience. These include:
 - MOH COVID-19 Updates webpage (<u>www.covid19.gov.vu</u>): primary source of official local information and supporting resources with 7,513 visits and over 3,599 unique visitors since 25 March.
 - Zero-data landing page (https://bit.ly/vanmoh): provides key messages to the public and is free from smart phones with Digicel and TVL.
 - Health Promotions Vanuatu Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/Health-Promotions-Vanuatu-1674266679566197/): used to disseminate new information and links to the webpage.
 - Information Hotline (119): operates 7-days a week from 6.30am to 10.30pm. Over 3,000 phone calls have been received since operation commenced on 24 March 2020. A log of all queries is being generated so as to update key messages and Questions and Answers for use during community engagement and on the website. Many non-health queries are being received (mainly on directives related to the State of Emergency) so the Hotline scope will be expanded in coordination with NDMO and VCCI.

Health Operations

- Prevention and mitigation: Intensive community awareness campaigns have been conducted throughout
 Port Vila since 21 March, with 10,356 people reached in the 5-wards by 01 April. Shefa Health has set up
 awareness teams, with activities to also target elsewhere in the province. Other provincial teams in
 collaboration with Government departments (ie. Department of Water Resources, Ministry of Education
 and Training) and partners have established plans and have commenced activities in the provinces. Teams
 disseminate key messages (eg. 5 things to know, 5 things to do) and field questions, which are then used
 to revise awareness materials (eg. Questions and Answers). Various trainings have been conducted
 including for medical staff and hotel staff supporting quarantines. Coordination is being strengthened to
 track relevant community awareness activities by MOH and partners; an online tool has been adapted for
 reporting, tracking and visualisation.
- Risk communication: Mass multi-media campaign continues on various platforms including radio interviews, talkback shows, jingles, SMS messaging, TV and newspaper. Increase in social media presence through social media (FB) and the zero-data landing page. Information Education Communication (IEC) materials targeting community members and health workers have been developed, translated and printed.

Files and printed materials continue to be sent to provincial teams. Additional materials for specific target audiences (e.g. pregnant women) and targeting specific public spaces (e.g. workplaces) are under development. Establishment of a clearing house with requisite process to expedite clearance of partner communications materials while ensuring consistency of messaging prior to use. To date 28 materials have been cleared. Partners are encouraged to: 1) share existing MoH materials that are posted on the website, 2) contact MoH before making new materials to reduce duplication efforts, and 3) send any new materials developed to covid19@vanuatu.gov.vu for approval before use.

- Surveillance: Surveillance has been expanded to include all quarantined individuals and their contacts. Daily
 health monitoring is provided for those in quarantine. None are currently considered suspected cases.
 Contact tracing SOPs and plan have been developed and are being implemented in Port Vila. Private
 healthcare providers have been engaged and will support MOH on case notifications. DHIS-2 to be used for
 data management.
- Clinical management: All provincial teams and VCH, NPH and Lenakel hospitals have activated their EOCs.
 VCH EOC met with specialists and sectional heads for coordination. TB ward has been renovated at VCH to
 be used for isolation. Action flow for triage, quarantine and isolation is under refinement. Sanma, Shefa,
 Malampa, Penama, Tafea and Torba provincial teams have activated EOCs and have produced Situation
 Reports, EOC structures and response plans. Activities have commenced. Training of healthcare workers on
 prevention, case management and use of personal protective equipment (PPE) has been conducted.

Finance, Administration and Logistics

- Renovation of the isolation ward at VCH complete. Tents set up for triage at VCH.
- Construction/renovation of additional facilities at MOH, VCH and NPH planned.
- PPE stocks have been received from partners and are being continually reviewed for re-stock. Coordination for supply of essential medicines and equipment to be strengthened between MOH and NDMO.
- EOC requests for finances and procurement of equipment/assets to be sent to NDMO for actioning.
- Resources and materials have been committed or provided by numerous partners. The Ministry of Health
 wish to express appreciation to the following for financial or in-kind contributions (alphabetically): Daily
 Post, DFAT, Digicel, French Embassy, IsraAID, MFAT, SPC, TVL, UNICEF, Wan Smol Bag, WHO, World Bank,

 activities will be established as time permits.
